AIM:

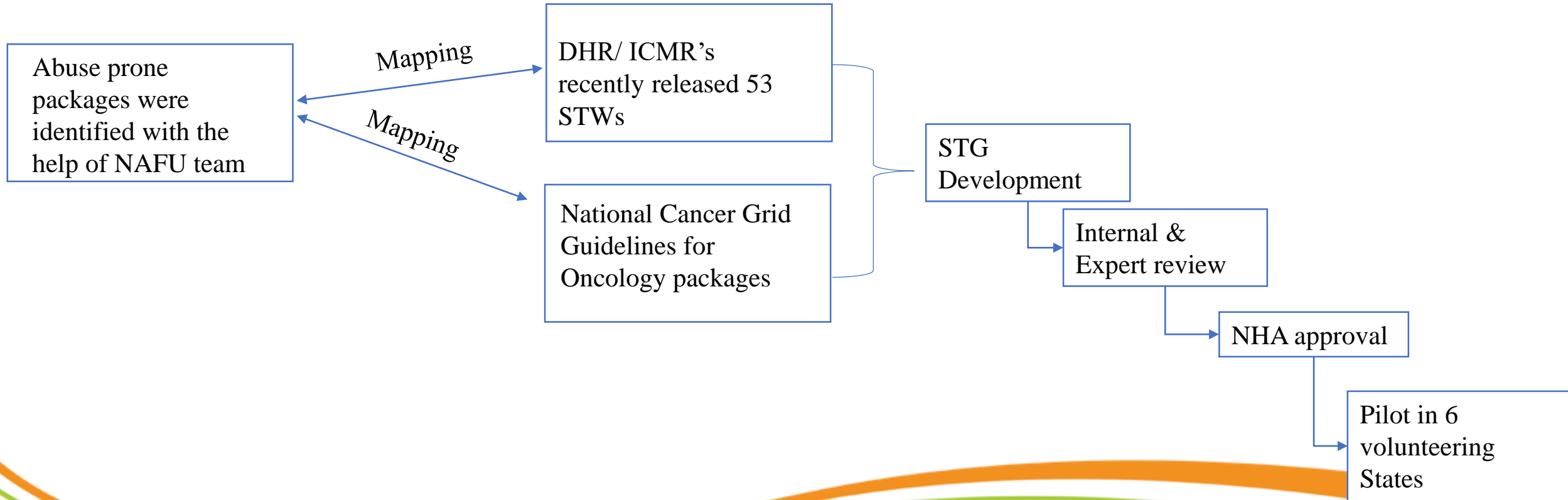

- **Guidance tool** for treating doctors, EHCPs, TPAs, ISAs, SHAs, medical auditors

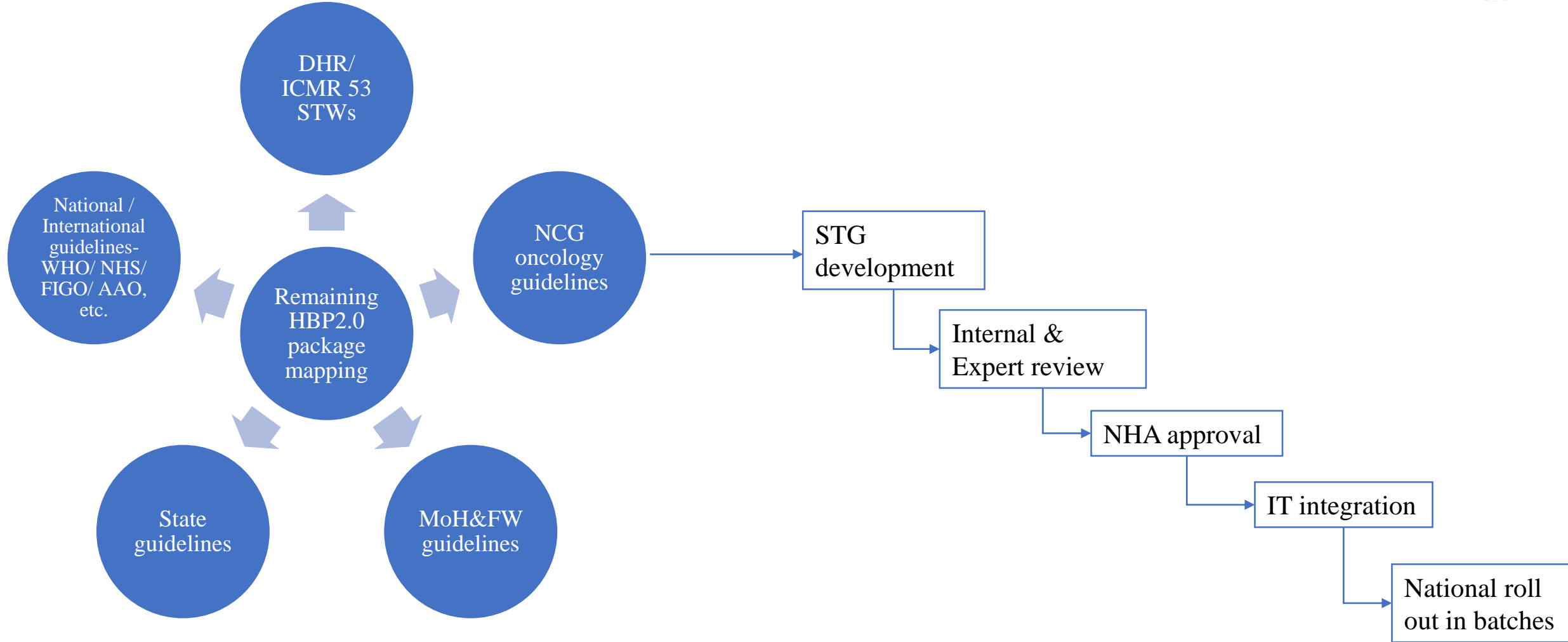


Background- Phase I



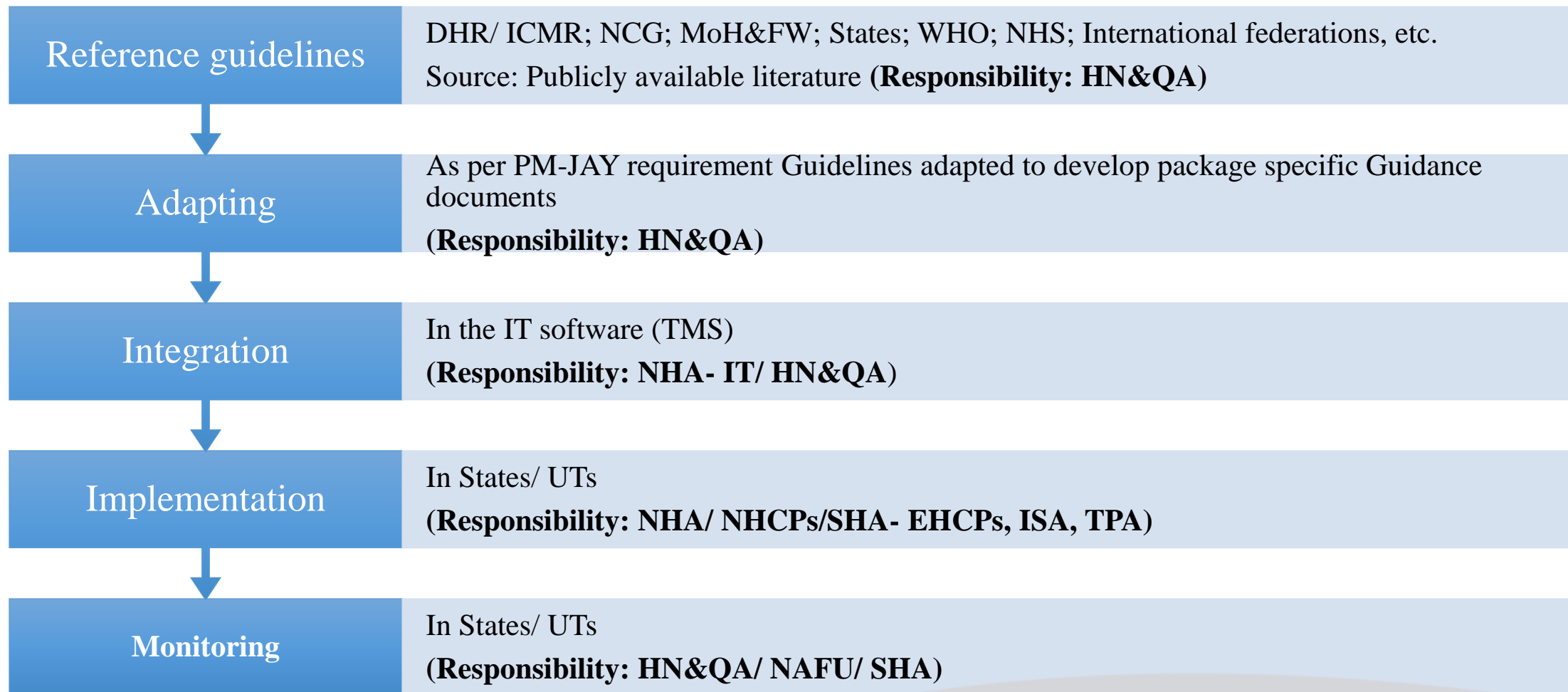


Background- Phase II

PART II: GUIDELINES FOR PROCESSING TEAM

2.1 **Objective:** To provide guidance to the pre-authorisation and claims processing team in ascertaining the medical necessity of procedure carried out vis a vis the patient's medical condition as evidenced by supporting documents/investigation reports etc. in deciding the admissibility and quantum of claim and compliance with mandatory documents by the hospital.

2.2 **Following mandatory documents to be diligently reviewed by the pre-auth / claims processing personnel:**

2.2.1 At the time of pre-authorization processing- For pre-authorisation processing doctor (PPD):

Cataract surgery with foldable hydrophobic acrylic IOL by Phacoemulsification technique/ Cataract surgery with non-foldable IOL using SICS technique

PART III: GUIDELINES FOR IT

3.1 **Objective:** To enable setting up of cross check mechanisms/rule engines within the IT platform (TMS) to ensure compliance with STGs and to prevent fraud / abuse of the Health Benefit Package.

3.2 **Below mentioned are the scenarios where a provision would be built in TMS for pop-ups:**

Cataract surgery with foldable hydrophobic acrylic IOL by Phacoemulsification technique/ Cataract surgery with non-foldable IOL using SICS technique:

- a. Best Corrected Visual Acuity (BCVA) < 6/9- Yes
- b. Previous cataract surgery done in the same eye- No

Part-4: In few Obs & Gyn STGs, additional part for auditors has been included



Way forward

- Remaining STGs being developed and approved
- Simultaneous completion of IT integration
- Orientation and training of States/ UTs/ NHCPs. Developing online training module
- Review of feedback from States/ hospitals/ TPAs & ISA (through States)
- Developing FAQs based on queries received during trainings
- Monitoring adherence to these guidelines through data analytics using IT platform
- Impact evaluation studies of using STGs on certain specific packages in selected States
